I. CALL TO ORDER-PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE-ROLL CALL

The Regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Ossining was held on February 10, 2026 at Birdsall-Fagan Police/Court Facility 86-88 Spring Street – Ossining, New York, 10562 and via video conference. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Supervisor Elizabeth Feldman, Members of the Board present were: Deputy Supervisor Gregory G. Meyer, Councilmembers Angelo Manicchio, and Matthew J. Weiss. Councilmember Jennifer Fields-Tawil was absent. Also present were Town Counsel Christie Tamm-Addona, Budget Officer Martha C. Quituisaca and Town Deputy Clerk Jeaneth Guinansaca.
