B. Permission to Sell Alcohol at Town of Ossining Earth Day

Resolved, that the Captain Lawrence Brewing Company, 6 Degrees or Less Brewery, and Sing Sing Kill Brewery are each authorized to operate a concession stand during the Earth Day Event held on April 26, 2025 at the Louis Engel Waterfront Park in the Town of Ossining and to sell, for consumption by persons over 21 years of age, at the event the companies' beer products. Captain Lawrence Brewing Company, Six Degrees or Less Brewery, and Sing Sing Kill Brewery will obtain, with consent from the Town, all necessary permits including an event permit from the New York State Liquor Authority and will provide proof of insurance and the letter of indemnity to the Town in a form acceptable to Counsel to the Town

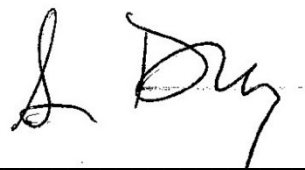
