

**Local Emergency Order No. 1
of the Town of Ossining**

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2026, a Local State of Emergency was proclaimed in the Town of Ossining related to impending extreme weather including an intense and large accumulation of snowfall; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Elizabeth Feldman, in my capacity as Supervisor and Chief Executive of the Town of Ossining and pursuant to the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and New York Executive Law § 24, in order to protect life and property hereby issue the following Local Emergency Order:

1. From 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 24, 2026 until 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 27, 2026, no vehicles shall stop, stand, idle or park on any Town roads in the unincorporated Town of Ossining.
2. The Village of Ossining Police Department, which services the unincorporated Town, is hereby authorized to issue tickets and/or tow, or arrange for the towing of, any vehicles violating this Order, with all costs related to towing and retrieval of the vehicle to be borne by the vehicle's owner.

This Local Emergency Order shall remain in effect until Wednesday, January 28, 2026 unless otherwise rescinded or extended by subsequent order.

**Proclaiming a Local State of Emergency
In the Town of Ossining**

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2026, the Governor of the State of New York issued Executive Order No. 57 declaring a disaster emergency throughout the State until February 22, 2026 due to forecasted extreme temperatures and a winter storm that are expected to cause hazardous conditions posing an imminent danger to public transportation, utility service, public health, and public safety systems throughout the State; and

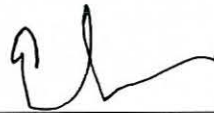
WHEREAS, on January 23, 2026, the County Executive of Westchester County issued a similar State of Emergency for the County; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Ossining is anticipating extremely cold weather conditions and an intense and large accumulation of snowfall that presents an immediate danger that will imperil public safety; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Elizabeth Feldman, Supervisor and Chief Executive of the Town of Ossining, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the laws of the State of New York, hereby finds, pursuant to New York Executive Law § 24, that the impending extreme weather is a public emergency in the Town of Ossining that imperils public safety and I do hereby proclaim and declare a local state of emergency in the Town of Ossining; and it is further

DECLARED, this Proclamation shall remain in effect for 30 days, until February 22, 2026, or until rescinded or extended by subsequent order.
